- 20 students taking Japanese (5 S4, 10 S5 & 5 S6); 3 students taking French (3 S4, 0 S5 & 0 S6); 5 students taking Spanish (2 S4 & 4 S5); 2 students taking Korean (1 S4 & 1 S5); totally 30 students
- Most students reflected that the program provided them with a chance to learn a foreign language, which is believed to benefit their future studies and career.
- Most students were satisfied with the course, including tutors' qualifications and venues, which were the major concerns in the previous year.
- S4 students performed much better in terms of assessments and attendance. This might be due to the stricter recruitment criteria and the easier syllabus. Such criteria would continue to be used in future recruitment.

Attendance

- S4: over 85% students achieve the 50% required attendance rate.
- S5: over 85% students achieve the 50% required attendance rate.

Applied Learning (ApL)**Total: \$57,325**

For S5-S6 students, 2 S5 students and 5 S6 students join the ApL courses. Their results are above average. Each of them covers from \$13,000-15,800.
